PSIRF in Practice (PIP)



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Overview

PSIRF education is essential for teams on the front lines of care delivery, as it helps them grasp systems thinking and build safety culture. NHS England has outlined specific training requirements for Learning Response Leads, Engagement Leads, and Oversight Leads. However, local feedback has highlighted a gap in practical training for frontline staff in utilising the various learning responses e.g SWARM, After Action Reviews. To address this need, a tailored course was developed and piloted for staff at Barts Health NHS Trust.

Objectives

- Demystify PSIRF processes and learning responses
- Share and build staff confidence to participate in learning responses
- Co-create a bank of scenarios and a PSIRF Toolkit
 Method
- The course, which lasted half a day, was led by a trained patient safety specialist
- The scenarios were co-designed by the patient safety specialist and the lead (within the specialty area) to suit the staff group attending by using relatable scenarios tailored to the specialty team
- All attendees completed an assessment questionnaire at the beginning and at the end of the session. The course also involved staff participating in a SWARM huddle and After Action Review role-play

Results

- Sessions have been delivered across all 4 hospitals at the trust over 9 ½ days
- The course has been delivered to over 100 MDT participants (plus one Patient Safety Partner)
- Pre-course data showed gaps in knowledge and confidence in the PSIRF vision
- Post-course data indicated:
 - √ 86% of attendees believed in the 4 key aims of PSIRF.
 - √ 73% and 60% of attendees, respectively, felt confident to do a
 SWARM and AAR
